areas, most of the population is concentrated in a central north to south area which includes some of the largest towns, including Northampton and Kettering. It is part of the Milton Keynes and South Midlands area identified by the Government for future growth. The county encompasses districts, quite different 7 separate each in their make up.Northamptonshire is a relatively wealthy area with low deprivation. Corby is the most deprived of the county's districts, followed by Northampton. The economy is based around the service sector, distribution and finance.



Super Output Areas (SOAs) are classified within this range to enable them to be analysed and this data to be used in the development and monitoring of rural and urban policies.





DDA disabled people.1-Disability status is a self-reported measure on the Labour Force Survey (LFS). Respondents are defined as DDA disabled if they reported health problems or disabilities which they expect to last for more than a year and either reported a progressive illness or that their health problems or disabilities substantially limited their ability to carry out normal day to day activities.

"DDA Disabled" refers to people likely to be covered by the Discrimination against Disability Act, as actual coverage protection by the DDA is only determined by a court or tribunal.










Education deprivation Where Northamptonshire ranks in England








Culture Spend, per head by similar Authorities
