



## Northamptonshire Area Profile

Northamptonshire is situated to the south of the East Midlands region. With a mixture of urban and rural areas, most of the population is concentrated in a central north to south area which includes some of the largest towns, including Northampton and Kettering. It is part of the Milton Keynes and South Midlands area identified by the Government for future growth. The county encompasses 7 separate districts, each quite different in their make up. Northamptonshire is a relatively wealthy area with low deprivation. Corby is the most deprived of the county's districts, followed by Northampton. The economy is based around the service sector, distribution and finance.

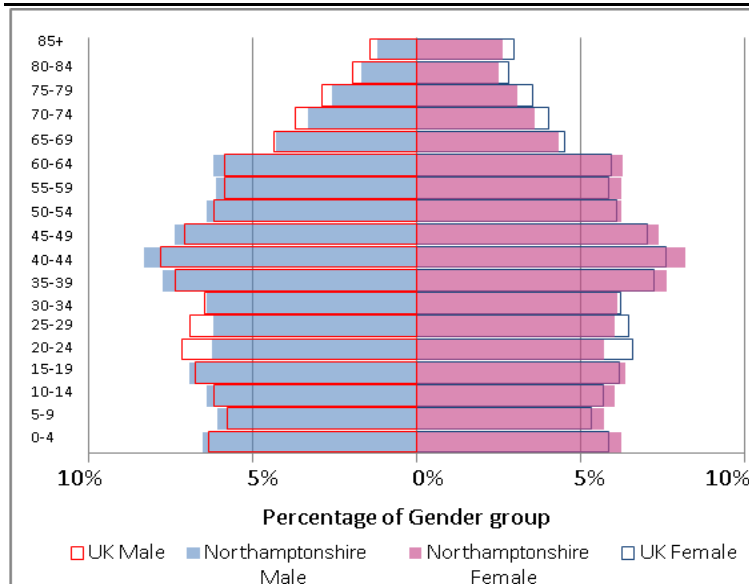

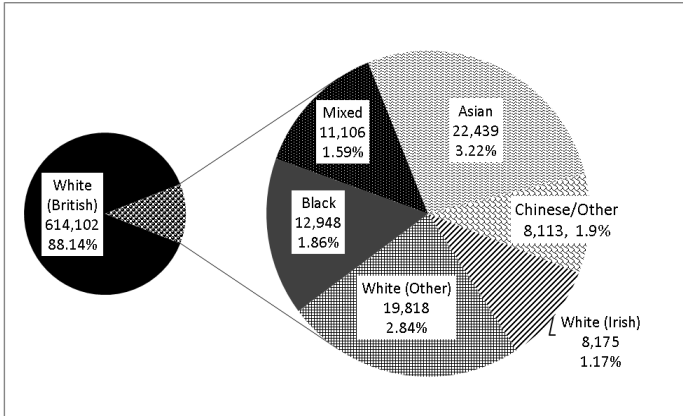

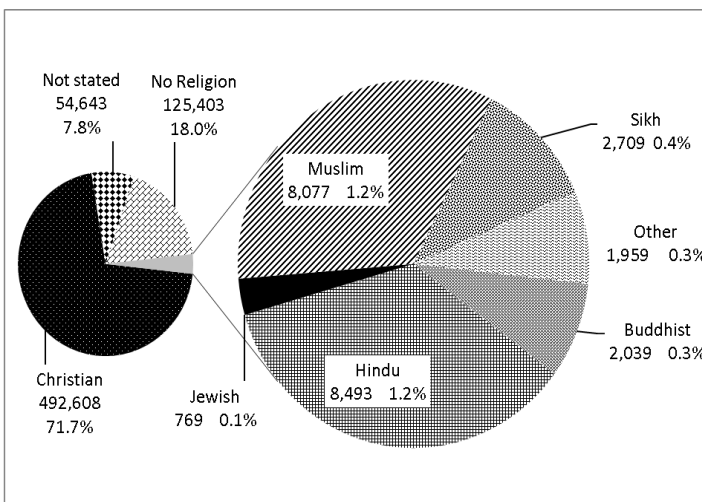


## Religion

## Sexual Orientation

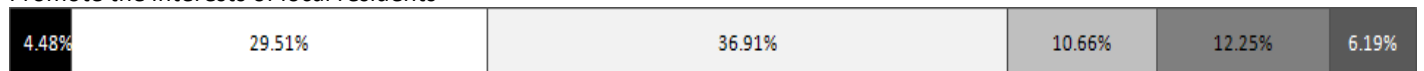

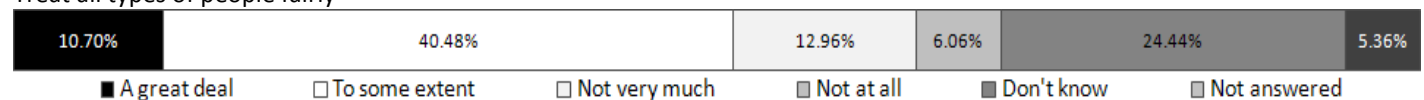

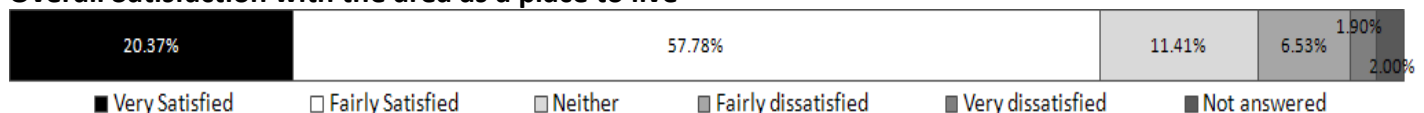

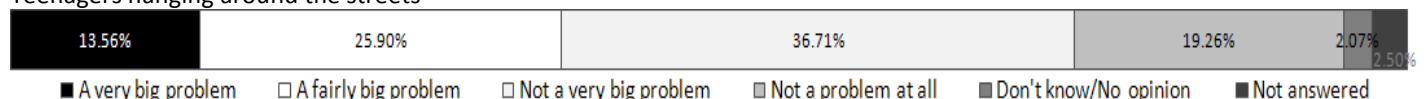

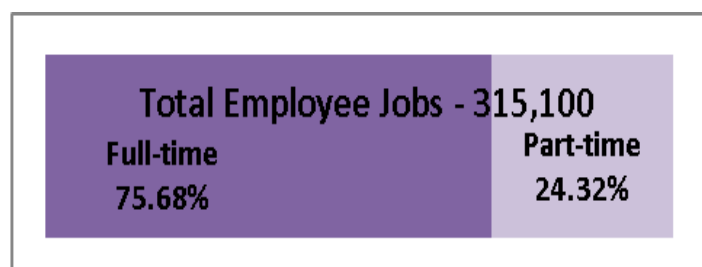

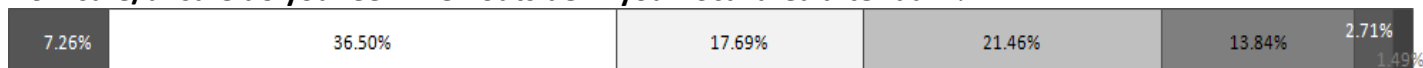

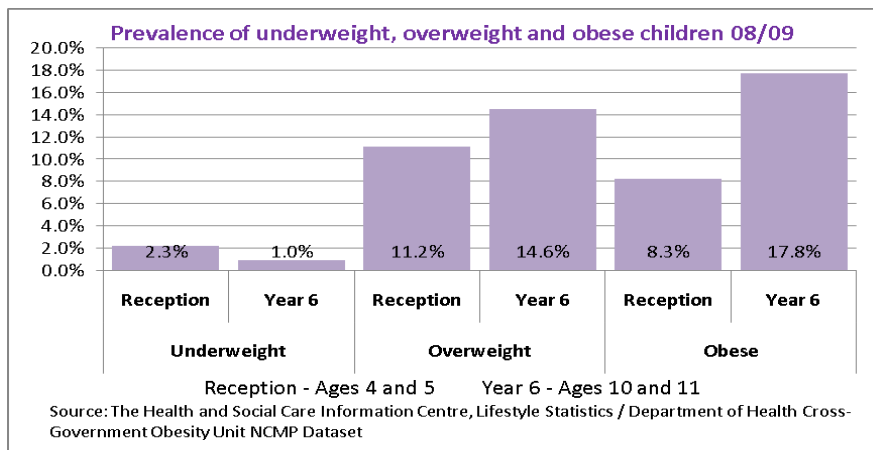

## Culture Spend, per head by similar Authorities



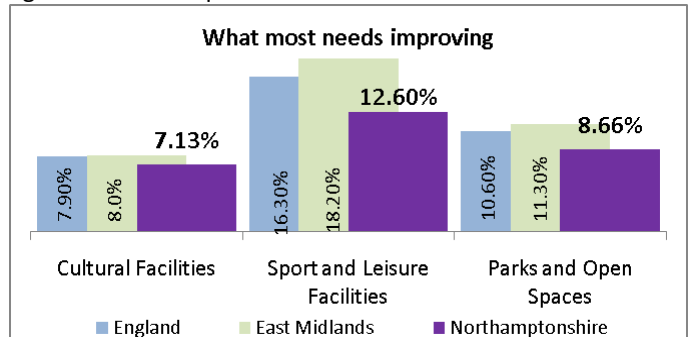
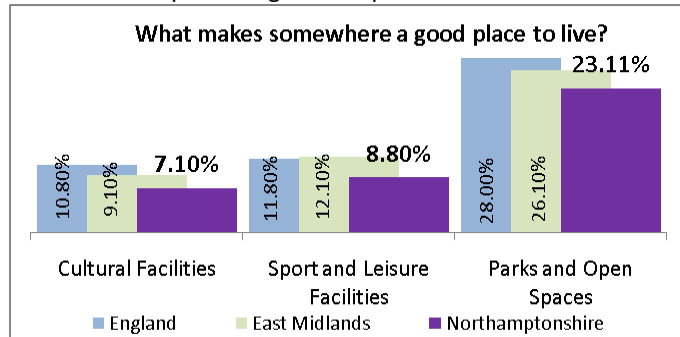
